Kansas City, Mo. — "Our support and prayers go out to Cpl. Nathan Cirillo's loved ones and the entire Ottawa community after yesterday's senseless shooting," said John W. Stroud, the national commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. "While many details behind the shooting remain unknown, this soldier's family and community need our support.
