

President Plans to Release VA Emergency Funding

WASHINGTON — An administration spokesperson announced today that the \$3.7 billion dollars in emergency funding will be released when President Bush returns from his Middle East trip later this week.

The VFW, who earlier had encouraged its 2.3 million VFW and Auxiliary members to write to President Bush and congressional representatives, wants to thank everyone for all the letters and phone calls on this most important issue, which VFW officials said: "Demonstrates that by working together as advocates, we can make a difference on behalf of all veterans."

- Hire additional claims processors and train staff to reduce the ever-growing disability claims backlog;

- Care for the hundreds of thousands of sick and disabled veterans from other conflicts, particularly as many of them grow older.
