

MAP's Adopt-A-Unit Brings VFW's Support to Troops

Post members also shared the latest *VFW Operation Uplink* "Free Call Day" information with them, so the unit knew when they could call home at no cost. The Post sent care packages too, and one Auxiliary member even made helmet liners to help the unit combat the cold winter.

When the unit arrived home, Post 8713 greeted them with a fun-filled homecoming party. MAP assisted with funding for it, so the Post was able to serve grilled steak and chicken, along with an assortment of other dishes, ranging from a vegetable medley and potato salad to cake. There was also a band to provide entertainment.

Parker knows how important Adopt-A-Unit is to the troops. "That's what kept them going, knowing that they had our support from home," she says.
