

Rhode Island Veteran Receives National VFW Award

Retired colonel continues serving veterans after long Army career

The colonel is an Iraq and Afghanistan veteran who served 36 years in uniform before being appointed as VFW Rhode Island's Department Service Officer in June 2016. According to his awards package, he used his personal experiences and leadership skills to successfully implement several best practices that streamlined office procedures, enhanced electronic recordkeeping, and developed and expanded higher-quality training methods. He is a Life member of VFW Post 2812 in Cranston, R.I.

"Colonel Denisewich earned this national honor for his tireless work ethic and commitment to ensuring America's veterans received the benefits they earned from the Department of Veterans Affairs," said VFW National Commander Brian Duffy.
