When Delgado graduates, he hopes to work as a manager at an Apple store, and feels his time as a Marine, and in combat in Afghanistan, has prepared him well.

"The Marines have taught me selflessness, dedication, professionalism and courage," said Delgado. "It gave me the discipline and initiative to never stop improving myself."

To other service members out there who are looking to the future, Delgado doesn't mince words ...
