Student and teacher entries are due by Oct. 31

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – For the past 70 years, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. has worked tirelessly to nurture patriotism through education, but time is running out for America's students and teachers to become a part of that legacy this year.

The VFW is still accepting applications for its popular Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen youth scholarship competitions, as well as its Teacher of the Year award. The application deadline for all three programs is Oct. 31.

Last year more than 122,000 sixth through eighth-grade students participated in the VFW Patriot's Pen essay competition. This year to win their slice of more than \$54,000 in national awards, students are being challenged to discuss *America's Gift to My Generation*.
